



Electric Neighborhoods: Integrated Organizational Network Application

Program Purpose: Healthy Neighborhoods Inc (HNI) received a federal grant to implement its “Electric Neighborhoods” program to pilot operational and capital workflows for residential decarbonization home improvement projects. Due to the technical complexity, HNI is sourcing architectural, engineering, energy modeling, and contractor partners for its “Integrated Organization Network” to increase successful project delivery.

Eligible Applicants: Architecture, Contractor, Energy Auditors, Engineering, Inspector Firms

Funding Source: This procurement is being conducted in accordance with the [requirements of the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency \(EPA\)](#). The resulting contract will be financed in whole or in part with funds provided by the EPA’s Thriving Communities Program. Contractors will be required to comply with applicable federal, state, and local laws, regulations, and requirements, including those set forth in 2 CFR Part 200 (Uniform Administrative Requirements, Cost Principles, and Audit Requirements for Federal Awards), EPA regulations, and all terms and conditions associated with the federal award. These include, but are not limited to, Davis-Bacon Act, Contract Work Hours and Safety Standards Act, and Equal Employment Opportunity.

Program Beneficiaries: HNI eligible Low-and- moderate income residents

Program Type: Non-competitive

Application Deadline: 6/1/26

Eligible Activities: Providing technical assistance for eligible decarbonization projects, including weatherization, life safety, electrical or appliance upgrades, and solar power systems.

Required Application Documents:

- A current copy of the applicant’s IRS Form W-9 (Request for Taxpayer Identification Number and Certification).
- A letter of good standing from the Maryland Department of Assessments and Taxation
- Portfolio of residential decarbonization project work related to your organization’s industry specialty
- Description of organization’s capacity to comply with federal regulations
- Proposed work plan and budget
- Contact information for your membership
